## "Mona Lisa unveiled" at Miami's Freedom Towers

The Miami Dade College (MDC), the city of Miami, Galleria Ca' d'Oro and the city of Margherita di Savoia are currently presenting an exhibition at Miami's Freedom Towers. The event is entitled "Mona Lisa Unveiled" and is running until 7 October.
